Supplement Report – 2017-016712

Narrative: At approximately 2100 hours on November 1, 2017, I responded to the Wal-Mart at 9901 Grant St. in reference to a shooting. Criminalist Dennis Davenport of the Commerce City Police Department, CSI Doug Young, and CSI Heather Hatfield also responded to the scene.

We were advised that at approximately 1810 hours on November 1, 2017, a white male wearing a red shirt, dark jacket, and blue jeans had entered the Wal-Mart through the Home & Living entrance, and began shooting.

Upon my arrival at Wal-Mart, I met with Officer Snook. Officer Snook led us to a room containing the surveillance cameras, and we were able to observe several vides that showed portions of the shooting.

I observed the following:

- An A USA 9mm Luger cartridge casing on the floor near the middle security gate of the store entrance (denoted by placard #1)
- An adult male wearing blue jeans, brown boots, and a blue long sleeved shirt lying on his left side on the floor near a fire extinguisher on a support pillar
- An A USA 9mm Luger cartridge casing on the floor under a Halloween makeup endcap display (denoted by placard #2)
- An A USA 9mm Luger cartridge casing on the floor under a shelf of roaster ovens near the entrance (denoted by placard #4)
- A pair of shoes, clothing, a purse, and suspected blood near register #32
- An adult male wearing a gray t shirt, denim shorts, and flannel jacket lying on his back near a battery and candy display
- An A USA 9mm Luger cartridge casing on the floor between an aisle containing Halloween makeup and throw blankets (denoted by placard #3)
- A bullet hole through a computer screen at register #32 (denoted by placard #5)
- A metal fragment on the floor between register #28 and #30 (denoted by placard #6)
- A metal fragment on the floor between register #29 and #27 (denoted by placard #7)
- A metal fragment on the floor between register #23, #24, #25, and #26 (denoted by placard #8)
- A projectile on a shelf between some plastic Halloween buckets (denoted by placard #9)
- An A USA 9mm Luger cartridge casing on the parking lot outside of the Garden Center (denoted by placard #12)
- An FC 223 cartridge on the parking lot outside of the Garden Center (denoted by placard #13 – believed to have come from Officer Schlenker)
- A metal fragment on the floor between register #28 and the shelf (denoted by placard #10)
- A metal fragment on the floor between register #22 and #20 (denoted by placard #11)
- An A USA 9mm Luger cartridge casing in a box containing shovels near a banana display (denoted by placard #14)
- A hole in the wall of the handicap accessible fitting room
- Metal fragments on the floor on the exterior of the back wall and the side of the handicap accessible fitting room (denoted by placard #15 and #17)
- A metal fragment on the floor of the handicap accessible fitting room (denoted by placard #16)
- Suspected bullet holes going through packages of Jack Links beef jerky and a defect in the post of register #28
